# Wage Bulletin CFMIEU EBA 2020-2023 

## From 1 March 2023

This wage bulletin contains information about the wage rates and allowances under the CFMEU (Victorian Construction and General Division) Enterprise Agreement 20202023 (the Agreement).

## How to use this wage bulletin

This wage bulletin has two sections:

- Part A - contains information on Pay Rates
- Part B - contains information on Allowances

Please refer to the relevant section for information on the relevant pay rates and or allowances.

## Important information

The rates of pay and allowances contained in this bulletin apply to companies that vote for and approve the Agreement. In accordance with section 54 of the Fair Work Act 2009 (Cth), an enterprise agreement comes into operation seven days after it is approved by the Fair Work Commission. This means that the rates of pay, and allowances outlined in the Agreement are applicable to a company seven days after the Agreement has been approved. The Agreement has no requirement to backpay employees to 1 October 2020.

The Agreement incorporates the Building and Construction General On-site Award 2010 (the Award) as at 19 December 2019 (PR715079), including all amendments up to and including this date. Accordingly, any changes to the Award after this date are not incorporated into the Agreement.

Under the Agreement, wages and allowances increase from 1 March 2021, 1 March 2022 and 1 March 2023. Superannuation increases on 1 July 2021, 1 July 2022 and 1 July 2023.
